Pick one of the following topics to complete as your end of book project.

Graphic novel (Comic Book)/ Flip book-Draw a picture of each 17 chapters in Number the Stars. In each panel, show what you think was the main event in that chapter. Write a brief caption for each panel that summarizes the action in your picture. Put each panel on a separate sheet of paper, and then bind them into a book.

A Study in Courage- Heroism displays itself in different ways. Think of five characters from <u>Number the Stars</u> who behave heroically. Create a presentation that explains what character does that is heroic.

Developing a Secret Code- In wartime, secrecy and code language are vital when conveying important information. Discuss how the the characters used code to convey important information. Then investigate the code that Navajo soldiers used to outwit the Japanese during WW II. Why was this code so successful? Create a presentation to inform your classmates about the Navajo Code Talkers.

Living with the Enemy- Imagine your town has been taken over by a force called Darkness. The Darkness's goal is to eliminate all brown or blond hair and blue and brown eyed people. Devise a rescue operation you might perform to save the targeted victims from annihilation. Create a presentation that explains your plan. Then discuss how this exercise helped you understand the real-life stresses the Danes were facing in WW II.

Country Report- Pick a country that was involved in WW II. Draw a large outline of the country on a piece of poster board paper. Draw and color the country's flag using crayons or colored pencils. Include the following information; name of the country, the capital, the size in square miles, your country's part in WW II, (Allied, Axis, Neutral, Occupied, not involved) the country's leader during WW II, population, resistance movement, fate of Jews. Make sure your map is correct, colored, neat, and make sure your name is on it.
